Educate Patients about Drowning Prevention as we Head into Summer

With swimming weather just around the corner, the National Drowning Prevention Alliance (NDPA) and the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) are providing information on how to protect children from drowning in response to the release of the CDC's latest Vital Signs report. Legislative Summary from 2024 Session

Maine AAP was proud to lead Providers for Gun Safety along with Maine's Gun Safety Coalition toward significant firearm reform with the successful passage of two pieces of legislation, LD 2224, "An Act to Strengthen Public Safety by Improving Maine's Firearm Laws and Mental Health System" and LD 2238, "An Act to Address Gun Violence in Maine by Requiring a Waiting Period for Certain Firearm Purchases." Together these bills help close existing loop holes in Maine law by strengthening background checks and requiring a 72 hour waiting period before the purchase of a firearm. Read More...

The Maine Gun Safety Coalition is partnering with police departments across Maine, the Maine AAP, and Humanium Metal to hold a Statewide Gun Give Back Event on Saturday, June 1st from 10AM to 2PM.Anyone in the state who has unwanted firearms can relinquish them to a participating police department anonymously during the event. The firearms will be destroyed, and the metal will be melted down to create artwork, microphones, jewelry and more. Learn more about the event here.

The 5 Cs is a mnemonic that can be used to talk to parents about kids and screens. They are: Child, Content, Calm, Crowding Out, and Communication.
