## Advocacy/Legislation

On Wednesday, May 10th, Maine Families for Vaccines will be hosting their <u>first ever day of</u> <u>advocacy</u> at the State house in Augusta at 1:00pm.

They'll be educating lawmakers about vaccines and why we need strong laws to keep Mainers safe from preventable diseases. There are currently 13 pieces of antivaccine legislation under consideration. We've had our advocates at every single hearing, testifying against any rollback to Maine's laws. The first 6 were voted Majority Ought Not To Pass by the Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs. While there remain a few final steps to fully defeat those bills, the committee votes in opposition are critical which is why <u>we're asking you to join us in-person</u>. You'll get a Maine Families for Vaccines t-shirt, lunch, and a chance to talk with lawmakers. Hope to see you there on Wednesday, 5/10!
