### Affordable, quality health insurance is offered through CoverME.gov - Share information with your patients and families!

**CoverME.gov** is where Mainers can find and enroll in quality health insurance plans that cover all essential benefits like annual exams, prescriptions, mental healthcare, and emergency services. Even better? 85% of people who enrolled through **CoverME.gov** last year received financial savings to lower their health insurance costs. Some people pay as little as \$10 or less a month.

You have until December 15 to enroll - let's go!

- Enroll by 12/15 for coverage that starts 1/1/25
- Final deadline to enroll is January 15 for coverage starting February 1

## Start at 9 Campaign

The Human Papillomavirus (HPV) is estimated to cause about 37,000 new cases of cancer each year in the U.S. The HPV vaccine is recommended for adolescents between the age 9 and 12, is safe, and is extremely effective in preventing HPV infections and cancers. Recent studies confirm that "on-time" series completion is critical to maximize efficacy against HPV cancers. Unfortunately, less than 30% of 13-year-olds in Maine

have completed the HPV vaccine series. This leaves most of that age group unprotected from future HPV cancers. Learn more from the Maine Immunization Program on how YOU can help.
